Where can Cambridge boys and girls learn teamwork, develop self-confidence, practice discipline and hard work, and have a lot of fun?

The North Division is not only the place, but for <u>70 seasons</u>, our youth baseball program has made important differences in the lives of children every season.

Community Reach. Since 1953, the North Division has provided a positive experience to North Cambridge girls and boys each year from March through October. We serve over 150 of our young neighbors annually, plus a large community of coaches and families.

Leagues. The program includes 3 Major League teams (ages 10-12), 4 Minor League teams (ages 7+), and a Farm League for nearly 40 players (ages 5+). In 2022, we launched a new Junior League to get players ready for the Minor League program. This new program was very successful and had over 25 participants. We again offered an extremely popular summer League program and clinics for our players from July through Halloween. In addition, we initiated a fall ball playing schedule involving the three other divisions of the Cambridge Little Baseball League.

Clinics. We are again offering to our players an indoor baseball clinic from mid-February through early April. The Board of Directors continues to make improvements to our player development, such as offering a clinic for all players in collaboration with professional coaches from the High School and Baseball 108.

Improved Technology. We encourage you to visit our website nclbl.org, which we have recently upgraded to provide better communication to our families and community. Additionally, we recently moved to a new team management platform which provides significant enhancements to better serve our league.

Scholarships. Thanks to your support, we have continued to offer scholarships to players unable to pay the NCLBL registration fee, removing all economic barriers.

The Board of Directors oversees the annual budget for equipment, uniforms, insurance, umpires, and trophies.
